

Telegenetics Training Opportunity

Interested in becoming a leader in telegenetics?

Telehealth is becoming widely recognized as an efficient way to increase access to genetic services and education. Mandated reimbursement for telehealth services is expanding in many states throughout the nation.



The New England Regional Genetics Network in collaboration with the Western States Regional Genetics Network has developed and implemented an introductory telegenetics training program for genetic counselors and genetic counseling students.

The program includes:

1. Ten self-paced on-line modules (~15 minutes each)
 2. Two live webinars (1 hour and 1.5 hours)
 3. A MANDATORY one day in-person, hands-on training
- If you are accepted, there is no cost to participate in this training. 1.01 Category 1 CEU will be provided for practicing genetic counselors at no cost to participants. Preference is given to applicants working in or planning to work in New England.
 - New England in-person trainings, hosted by the University of Massachusetts will be held on April 6, 7, and 8, 2020. To apply, visit:

 - Click "Western States Telegenetics Training", then "Apply for Training". New England applicants should select ONLY 4/6, 4/7, or 4/8. The one-day on-site training will be held at the UMass School of Nursing in Springfield, MA. Once you fill out the initial registration form and are approved for the course, you will receive a welcome email with further instructions. The application deadline is February 14, 2020, with notification on February 21, 2020.
